

Appendix of Acronyms

PPH = Poage Powell Hamilton: the best neighborhood in all of La Crosse to live, work, and play

NRC = Neighborhood Revitalization Commission: This is a City of La Crosse board, made up of selected recognized neighborhood association members, along with the mayor and other institutions in the community. Together they work towards the revitalization of the neighborhoods in La Crosse. PPH Treasurer/Past President and City Council Member Phil Ostrem is a member of this board.

JDC = Joint Development Corporation: This is a task force between the City of La Crosse and Gundersen Health System that moves forward the goals and initiatives of the Joint Neighborhood Plan and Campus Plan

LNDC = La Crosse Neighborhood Development Corporation: This group has been in a strategic planning phase, but is poised to soon be a nonprofit in the city of La Crosse that will be available to assist the neighborhoods of La Crosse with housing and economic development projects, improving neighborhood livability and marketing he city as a great place to live.
