As committed to in our department's Mission Statement, we continue to promote safety, reduce risks, and respond to calls for fire suppression, emergency medical services, and all-hazards rescue. We continue to strive to earn our community's trust through preparedness, professionalism, and dedicated to service.

April LCFD Highlights:

- April 2nd, LCFD responded to a fire at Alter Metal Recycling, 2410 Hauser Street around 5:00pm. Crews came upon the scene to find a large fire and heavy black smoke. Due to volume of scrap cars and limited access to the area, it took almost two hours to control the fire, using several thousand gallons of water per minute. 24 firefighters responded with assistance from LCPD, TSA, Xcel Energy, La Crosse County EDC, the Salvation Army, and employees of Alter Metal Recycling. The cause the fire remains under investigation.
- April 9th, 13th, & 16th, LCFD in partnership with the School District of La Crosse held a workshop to educate students on pre-hospital emergency medical services. In total, 45 high school seniors participated and the workshop concluded with the students participating in a mass casualty triage exercise.
- April 18th, LCFD responded to a fire at Viterbo University's Marian Hall at 2:15am. The first unit responded on location within four minutes and upon arrival met with Viterbo security personnel. A fire had been intentionally set by a student in a garbage can. It had been extinguished prior to LCFD arrival, but crews assisted with ventilating smoke. An arrest has been made and the individual has been charged.
- April 19th, LCFD responded to a vehicle fire at 1020 5th Avenue South at 4:03am. Engine One responded to a car smoking and flames coming from the rear window. Once the fire was contained, it was apparent due to other damages to the car, the fire was set intentionally. This incident is still under investigation in partnership with LCPD.
- April 22nd, LCFD responded to a dumpster fire at 402 6th Street South at 9:26pm. Upon arrival, crews found a fully involved plastic dumpster on fire in the parking lot behind the listed address. The fire was quickly extinguished by personnel assigned to Quint One. The fire was set intentionally and thanks for surrounding business cameras, the subject was identified and arrested.
- April 24th, LCFD in partnership with La Crosse County Sheriff's Department, ADRC of La Crosse County, La Crosse County
 Prevention Network, and the Alliance to Heal held a "Drug Take Back Event" at the La Crosse County Health & Human
 Services parking lot. A total of 358 cars visited the drive-thru and a total of 550 pounds of pills were collected. Also, 22
 boxes of ointments, inhalers, gels, and liquids were also collected.
- April 24th, LCFD responded to a mutual aid request at W5655 State Road 33 to assist the La Crosse County Sherrif's Department with a fire investigation.







Apparatus Average Response Time (HH:MM:SS)




Unit 90th Percentile Turnout Time






