

January LCFD Highlights:

- January 10th, LCFD responded to a house fire at 5203 Mormon Coulee Road. The fire was caused by the use of an old torch heater, estimated to be from the 1950s. Thirty-six firefighters from LCFD and Shelby Fire Departments responded to scene. Crews arrived shortly after 2:00 a.m. and were on site until 10:30 a.m. The building sustained heavy fire and smoke damage and the owner/occupant unfortunately passed away the following day.
- January 10th, LCFD responded to a Mutual-Aid call (house fire) to assist the Holmen Area Fire Department at N7007 Sunrise Lane in the town of Holland. Forty-six firefighters, including crews from the Town of Campbell and City of Onalaska, fought the laundry-related fire from 1:00 a.m. through 5:00 a.m. No injuries were reported.
- January 11th, LCFD responded to a structure fire at Edwards Mini Storage on the corner of 4th Street South and Winnebago Street. The fire was under control within 20 minutes, but there was heavy smoke and fire damage to eight of the units. No injuries were reported and fire still remains under investigation.
- January 12th, LCFD responded to a Mutual-Aid call (house fire) to assist the Onalaska Fire Department at 413 5th Avenue North. Two dogs perished at the scene, but no other injuries were reported. The fire still remains under investigation.
- January 19th, LCFD responded to a house fire at 210 22nd Street South around 4:30 p.m. Twenty-nine firefighters were on scene with assistance from the HAFD, LCPD, and Tri-State Ambulance. The fire was extinguished quickly but the home sustained heavy smoke damage and moderate fire damage. Two adults and three children were evacuated safely and no other injuries were reported. The fire was believed to be caused by outside burning of vegetation.
- January 24th, LCFD responded to an assistance call from the LCPD at 2900 Ebner Coulee Road to search for a person on the bluff. Fire crews performed a technical slope evacuation and the patient was then transferred to a nearby medical facility. Fourteen firefighters responded to the call and the Shelby Fire Department was requested to standby for coverage on South side.






2019 vs. 2020




Total Calls by Type








Total Specialty Team Calls








