We continue to strive to earn our community's trust through preparedness, professionalism, and dedicated to service.

February LCFD Highlights:

- February 1st, LCFD responded to a fire on the back staircase at 304 Pearl Street around 10:00pm. The first unit was on the scene in three minutes and fifty seconds. Crews put a quick stop on the exterior fire. They continued to check for and extinguish fires inside the main building as well as surrounding locations. The main building sustained heavy smoke and fire damage. 54 personnel and 18 apparatus responded to the incident. We were assisted by the Shelby Fire Department, Holmen Area Fire Department, Onalaska Fire Department, La Crescent Fire Department, LCPD, TSA, and Xcel Energy.
- February 4th, LCFD presented six-year-old Liam the Lifesaver Award (and a gift of Legos) outside of Emerson Elementary.
 On January 20th, Liam woke to the smell of smoke inside his family's home. He knew something wasn't right and alerted his parents immediately. Because of his quick thinking, his family was able to safely evacuate before the smoke alarms sounded.
- February 9th, Rescue 1 successfully helped deliver a baby in a vehicle during –14°F weather. Mom and baby boy are doing great!
- February 9th, LCFD responded to a garage fire behind 2012 21st Street South at 3:47pm. Crews responded under four minutes and were able to gain access and extinguish the fire within five minutes. Damage was limited to a small area of combustibles and a heater; which combined, was lead to believe the cause of the fire. 20 firefighters responded with assistance from LCPD and TSA.
- February 19th-23rd, LCFD in partnership with La Crosse County Health Department and the Salvation Army, conducted COVID-19 antigen testing for La Crosse's unsheltered population.
- February 22nd, LCFD responded to an oven fire at 719 Losey Boulevard North at 2:43pm. Prior to arrival, the fire was extinguished by the tenant. Crews assisted with removing the oven, ensuring there were no remaining hotspots, and ventilating the residence.
- February 27th, LCFD responded to a house fire at 315 Rose Street at 12:15pm. The first arriving unit found evidence that a significant fire had occurred inside the structure and appeared to be extinguished for quite some time. Tenants reported they had not been home and had been gone for an extended period of time prior to discovering the fire. The incident is still under investigation.

March LCFD Highlights:

- March 4th, LCFD responded to a call of someone who appeared to have fallen through the ice behind Lauderdale Place shortly after 5:00pm. The first LCFD unit was on scene with five minutes. On arrival, crews observed some fishing gear next to a hole in the ice where it appeared someone had fallen through. After searching with water rescue divers and under water cameras along with the assistance of LCPD, it was determined that two individuals had fallen through the ice but were able to get themselves out and left the scene. 17 personnel and seven pieces of apparatus responded to this emergency with assistance from the LCPD, TSA, the La Crosse County Dive Team and the DNR.
- March 8th, LCFD responded to an apartment fire at 1208 Avon Street around 7:00am. Fire trucks were on scene under
 four minutes and were met with thick black smoke coming from a second story apartment. All building tenants were able
 to exit safely and there were no injuries to report. The cause and origin of this fire has not yet been released. A total of
 22 personnel responded to this fire along with TSA, Xcel Energy, LCPD, and the American Red Cross.
- March 12th, LCFD presented Logan Middle Schooler, Sam King, with the Lifesaver Award. During a house fire on February 22nd, Sam recognized that something was wrong in his house, remained calm, notified the adults, and called 911.
 Thankful to his quick thinking and reacting, his family was able to extinguish the fire and evacuate safely.
- March 22nd, Spectrum News out of Milwaukee, Wisconsin published a story covering current and former LCFD members. Current LCFD Battalion Chief Bee Xiong and former LCFD firefighter Xiong Yang are the only two Hmong firefighters within the State of Wisconsin. "I've always been pretty proactive trying to recruit Hmong people into the fire service. Whenever we get into family fathers and stuff and people ask what I do for a living and I tell them I am a firefighter, you see the younger kids perk up and I say, you can be one too, this is what you need to do" says Battalion Chief Xiong.
- March 25th, LCFD responded to a structure fire at 106 10th Street South at 12:52pm. The structure is a two-story house that is split into four residential units. LCFD arrived on scene within four minutes to find heavy smoke coming from the front and side of the first floor apartment. The fire was contained to a single apartment unit and no injuries were reported. A total of 21 personnel and ten apparatus responded to the fire along with TSA, LCPD, and Xcel Energy.
- March 25th, LCFD presented three women with Lifesaver Award at the La Crosse YMCA. Madisyn, Angie, and Laura
 performed CPR and helped to save a man's life earlier this month.
- March 29th, LCFD responded to a structure fire 3101 Lauderdale Court at 1:03pm. The first unit was on scene within five
 minutes to find smoke coming from first floor and the chimney of the house. A total of 23 personnel and 18 apparatus
 responded to the fire along with Shelby Fire Department, Holmen Area Fire Department, LCPD, TSA, and Xcel Energy.









Response Times for All Call Types - March 1st, 2020 - February 28th, 2021


Percentage of Apparatus Response Times Under 9 Minutes




Apparatus 90th Percentile Response Time (HH:MM:SS)



Apparatus Average Response Time (HH:MM:SS)




Unit 90th Percentile Turnout Time






