October LCFD Highlights:

- October 3rd-9th was Fire Prevention Week. This year's theme was "Learn the Sounds of Fire Safety".
 Additional details are available on page seven.
- October 4th, LCFD responded to a structure fire at 432 South Second Street at 8:50pm. The initial report was of a smoke detector sounding and the smell of smoke. Nothing was showing upon arrival and it appeared the fire had extinguished itself. While searching the home, a deceased person was found, who was later identified as the home owner. This fire is still under investigation. Other agencies on scene were LCPD and TSA.
- October 8th, LCFD responded to a technical rescue at Miller Bluff at 7:10pm. The incident turned into a recovery
 effort that required extensive technical rescue. LCFD was assisted by the La Crosse County Sheriff's Office, LCPD,
 TSA, EDC, and the La Crosse County Medical Examiner's Office. A total of 14 firefighters responded to this
 incident.
- October 23rd, LCFD in partnership La Crosse County services, held a Drug Take Back Event. Additional details of this event and the outcome are on page seven.
- October 25th, LCFD responded to a structure fire at 615 7th Street South at 12:08am. A person was reported to
 be trapped in a bedroom with a dog. Fire crews quickly gained access to the first floor apartment and located the
 person and their dog and both were evacuated safely. Two more people were located in a second floor
 apartment were also evacuated safely. The cause of fire is still under investigation. 20 firefighters responded to
 this incident along with assistance from LCPD, TSA, and EDC.


