

August LCFD Highlights:

- August 9th, LCFD presented the Lifesaver Award to LCPD officers Dakota Marcon and Hayden Halverson for their quick action in applying two tourniquets to a patient who had a severe laceration that resulted in a severed artery. This action resulted in saving the patient's life!
- August 16th, LCFD responded to medical emergency call on a hiking trail at 700 County Road FA. Upon arrival, crews made contact with bystanders and were directed to patient who was approximately .25 mile into the trail.
 LCFD USAR members prepared to evacuate the patient by using a slope evacuation system. TSA was also on scene and assisted with transport and patient care. A total of twelve LCFD personnel were on scene.
- August 23rd, LCFD personnel mitigating an oil leak after a car fire near Ace Hardware on the southside. Quint 3
 and Rescue 3 were able to extinguish the fire shortly after arriving on scene. The vehicle was leaking oil that was
 flowing into a nearby sewer drain. Personnel quickly built a berm with Oil-Dri and dirt from the area to contain
 the leak and then used absorbent pads to soak up the oil.

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

Incidents by Category and Year-Month




Unit 90th Percentile Turnout Time




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

- Trained RA's from Viterbo University on fire safety






Total Reach via Facebook (67,000 people)
