- August 7th, LCFD responded to a structure fire at 1313 South Avenue around 2:00 am. Crews arrived with four minutes to find a detached garage and camper full involved in fire. The fire was extinguished quickly, preventing the fire from extending to the home. Fire investigators determined the fire started from ashes/embers that were not extinguished and disposed of properly.
- August 16th, LCFD responded to a structure fire at 2532 East Avenue around 1:45 am. Crews arrived to find a detached garage on fire. It was extinguished quickly and no injuries were reported. Fire Investigators determined the fire was started intentionally.
