Department Highlights:

- The City of La Crosse and LCFD received an award from the 7 Rivers Cardiac Arrest Preparedness and Education for the dedication put forth in getting La Crosse named a "Hearts Safe Community".
- Fire Prevention Week took place between October 8th-14th.

Notable Incidents:

- October 3rd, LCFD responded to a deck fire at 622 Rose Street at 8:21pm. Crews arrived on scene to the fire already extinguished but stayed on scene to investigate. Even though the incident took place outside of the residence, crews still assisted with clearing the smoke from inside the apartment. The cause of the fire was improperly discarded smoking materials.
- October 19th, LCFD responded to a structure fire at 2010 14th Street South at 10:42pm. Crews arrived on scene to find a large amount of smoke coming from the back corner of the home. All residents were evacuated safely. The scene was cleared within an hour. The fire was caused by electrical arcing.
- October 21st, LCFD responded to a structure fire at 2522 Harvey Street at 10:18pm.
 Crews arrived on scene to find heavy smoke coming from the back of the home and basement. The fire was contained to the basement and all residents were evacuated safely. The cause of the fire is still under investigation.
