Notable Incidents:

- December 10th, LCFD responded to a structure fire at 2550 15th Street South at 12:21 pm. The fire was quickly extinguished and confined to the basement area. The cause of the fire is underdetermined.
- December 11th, LCFD responded to a structure fire at 227 7th Street South at 3:11 am. Crews responded within four minutes and the fire was extinguished quickly. The fire was contained to one unit within the apartment building and the cause has been determined to be electrical related.
